For a different perspective, tour this popular oceanfront park by sea kayak. Water routes pass clean shoreline, lighthouses and wildlife. "There are locations sheltered by offshore island, so the seas aren't as rough. Level of ability is really no problem," Kaiser says.

Yellow National Park, Wyoming and Montana

"One of the best ways to experience the nation's first national park is on two wheels," Kaiser says. Although traffic's heavy during peak summer season, there are several areas reserved just for summer cyclists. Kaiser recommends coming in the early spring, though, when the park is closed to cars, giving cyclists free rein.
